

A Message from the Vestry...

To the Parishioners of St. Andrew's,

Regarding the search for a new Rector, the Search Committee made a unanimous recommendation to the Vestry to issue a call for a new Rector. The Vestry unanimously voted to issue that call. The call has been accepted subject to St. Andrew's and the new Rector entering into a formal Letter of Agreement. Under Diocesan protocol, it is not official until we complete, and the Bishop also approves and executes, the Letter of Agreement with the new Rector. Until that time, again under Diocesan protocol, the Vestry cannot formally announce. That is why we have not done so yet. It is not that we have not wanted to do so. I know that a number of people have been frustrated with the process and the time it has taken. I have heard some of that frustration as recently as yesterday. It is my hope that the details can be completed possibly as soon as the end of next week or the week thereafter. Once that is done, we can and will make a formal announcement with more details as to the start date, which will hopefully be by October 1 or sooner if possible, and the road ahead. The Vestry received word yesterday that the St. James' equivalent of the Voice In the Desert announces the appointment of our new Rector. If you are wondering how St. James' obtained this information, the relatively new Rector at St. James' went to seminary with the individual to whom we issued the call. I believe he is excited to have his friend coming here to Las Cruces and is happy for St. Andrew's in general. To say the least, so are we. The Vestry very much looks forward to making a formal announcement soon. Thank you for everything you do for St. Andrew's.
